PRESENTATION

The 9th Congress of the Regional Studies Group (AGE) aims to be a place for meeting, reflection, and discussion on research into the topics of territory, intelligence, and sustainability. From a regional perspective, it will focus on the keys to the processes and results that can make the territory increasingly intelligent and sustainable, as well as on the methodological contributions that measure, assess, and explain these processes and results.

Since the end of the 20th century, concern for the sustainability of the planet has been growing, and we are currently focused on achieving the United Nations' 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) set out in the 2030 Agenda, which was approved in 2015. At the same time, an information society has developed, within which the large majority of the population establishes relations, in political, economic, social, administrative, labour, and consumer terms, through information and communication technologies (ICT). Likewise, the growing digitalisation of society is giving rise to the concept of the "smart territory", a sustainable territory that provides, with the use of ICT and emerging technologies, a high quality of life for its inhabitants. This is facilitated through optimal management of the territory's resources, and knowledge-based decision-making based on its dynamics. The concept of territorial intelligence can be seen at a local, urban level with "smart cities", but it is also being applied to the rural environment in so-called "smart villages". At a regional scale (sub-national spatial level), the European Union adopts a territorial approach to smart specialisation in the Regional Innovation Systems (RIS).

The development of smart territories involves a wide range of variables from distinct domains (political, economic, infrastructural, social, and technological). It is a process that develops a strategic vision characterised by the identification of the domains of greatest strategic potential; the development of multi-stakeholder governance mechanisms; the establishment of priorities; and the use of supportive policies to maximise the potential for knowledge-based development. Within this context, this 9th Congress welcomes scientific contributions on the following principal themes:

- 1.- Smart territories and innovation.
- 2.- Governance, development, and sustainability: SDGs and Agenda 2030
- 3.- International cooperation, planning and social development: the new knowledge societies.

These will cover key issues, such as those listed below:

- Sustainable economic development: transformation, innovation, and new challenges of economic activities.
- Governance: territorial planning and management. Agenda 2030 and SDGs.
- Knowledge, Innovation, ICT, Artificial Intelligence, Information Society.
- Environmental challenges: energy, water, silent pollution. Environmental resilience and adaptation.
- New knowledge societies, smarter and more sustainable social metamorphosis.
- Smart and sustainable infrastructures.

PUBLICATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS

After peer review, the long abstracts (1,500-2,000 words) of the accepted papers will be published in a Proceedings Book with the ISBN of the Spanish Association of Geography (AGE). Those contributions selected by the Scientific Committee, after they have been peer-reviewed and then defended at the Congress, will be proposed for expansion to be published either:

a. in article format, in the *Revista de Estudios Andaluces (Journal of Andalusian Studies)*, indexed in the database of the Web of Science Emerging Sources Citation Index, JIF-WoS 0, 5- Q3 and Class A in B1/11-ANVUR. They must conform to the publication rules of the journal and pass the established evaluation process (double-blind peer review).

or

b. as a book chapter in a monograph indexed in a Scholarly Publishers Indicators (SPI). They must conform to its publication rules.

RULES FOR THE SUBMISSION OF PAPERS

Pre-registration and brief summary.

The author/s must initially specify, in their pre-registration: the title of the paper; the key words of the text (3-6), preferably not already used in the title; and an abstract in Spanish and English, which should be around 250-300 words, including: proposal and state of the issue; methodology; main results; and conclusions, following the established template.

Long summary.

Subsequently, once the short abstract has been accepted, and on the date mentioned in the calendar, the full abstract will be submitted in Spanish or English. This should be between 1,500-2,000 words, with the usual structure of a scientific document: introduction, methodology, results, discussion, conclusions, and references.

The text of the proposed contribution must be sent in a single Word document (.docx), following the established template, including tables, maps, and figures (diagrams, graphs, and photographs), in A4 page size with 3cm margins, in single-spaced, fully justified, 12-point Calibri font, except for the title of the paper (in 14-point capital letters). Paragraphs should not be indented and should be single-spaced. Headings must be numerical with a maximum of two orders, according to the following guidelines: Arabic numerals and bold (12 point), in upper case for the first order and lower case for the second (e.g.: 2., 2.1.). Tables, maps, and figures (diagrams, graphs, and photographs) should not account for more than 20% of the total contribution.

Tables, maps, and figures (diagrams, graphs, and photographs) should be inserted into the text in the appropriate place, in Word format, with Arabic numerals and a brief title in Calibri 12-point Roman font. Figures (diagrams, graphs, and photographs) must be presented in a form suitable for direct reproduction. In all cases, the font should be Calibri 10-point Roman. References and citations must conform to APA7 standards in their 2018 version.
